My Grammar Worksheet - Past Simple





Verbs can tell us when something was done. We use the past simple for completed actions in the past.

Yesterday, Pingu walked to the shop.





Last week, Pinga played with the crab.



Regular verbs form the past simple by adding 'ed', 'd' or 'ied'. Play + ed = played

If the verb ends in e add 'd'. Bounce + d = bounced



If the verb ends with consonant + y remove the 'y' and add 'ied'. Study - studied



With the past simple we often use time phrases to say when the action happened e.g. this morning/afternoon, yesterday, last week, last month/year, a year ago.
