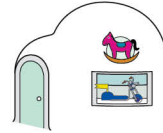


# My Grammar Worksheet – Past Simple



Verbs can tell us when something was done. We use the past simple for completed actions in the past.

Yesterday, Pingu walked to the shop.



Last week, Pingu played with the crab.



Regular verbs form the past simple by adding 'ed', 'd' or 'ied'.

Play + ed = played

If the verb ends in e add 'd'.  
Bounce + d = bounced



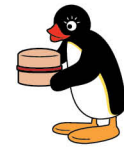
If the verb ends with consonant + y remove the 'y' and add 'ied'.  
Study – studied



With the past simple we often use time phrases to say when the action happened e.g. this morning/afternoon, yesterday, last week, last month/year, a year ago.

Now change the verbs in these sentences to form the past simple.

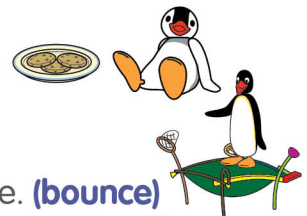
1. Yesterday, Mommy \_\_\_\_\_ a delicious cake. (bake)



2. Last week, Pingu \_\_\_\_\_ to school every day. (walk)



3. After dinner, Pingu \_\_\_\_\_ more cookies. (want)



4. In the afternoon, Daddy \_\_\_\_\_ on the trampoline. (bounce)



5. This morning, Pingu \_\_\_\_\_ 20 hiccups. (count)



6. Pingu \_\_\_\_\_ hard at school yesterday. (study)
